
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
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
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About the SOPA Awards for Editorial Excellence

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Message from Editorial Chair and Head of Judges

While it might be a cliché to characterize the past twelve months as another record year for journalism in Asia Pacific, it's worthwhile to look closely at some of those records – among them titles for the region with "the world's biggest prisons for journalists and bloggers" and "the biggest number of 'Predators of Press Freedom,'" according to Reporters Without Borders. Global threats to journalism, such as the spread of "fake news" and the application of that term by some world leaders to credible news reports they dislike, have also made the environment for practicing journalism in the region tougher than ever.

Still, it's important to look at some other records, records based on unassailable facts: the 2017 Society of Publishers in Asia Awards garnered more than 750 entries, an all-time high, with several categories such as Explanatory Reporting and Human Rights Reporting registering a record number of entries. Those numbers demonstrate that journalists in Asia remain unbowed by the many threats they face and continue to produce outstanding news reports across media and across borders. The varied topics represented in those numbers also demonstrate how essential the role of journalist as watchdog is in our region: corruption, human trafficking, governmental complicity in murder, animal poaching, just to name a few.

The large number of entries this year unavoidably produced another threat – a threat to the all-too-little free time of the industry professionals who serve as SOPA judges. The credibility of the SOPA Awards depends in large part on the independence, irreproachability and high standards of its judges and, on behalf of the entire SOPA Editorial Committee, we'd like to thank the more than 100

indefatigable individuals who volunteered their time to evaluate this year's submissions.

None of these threats show any sign of dissipating. But the winners we celebrate here tonight give us hope that no threat can stand in the way of another year of outstanding journalism ahead in 2017.

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Keynote Speaker

The Rt Hon. Lord Patten of Barnes CH

Christopher Francis Patten was born in 1944, educated in London and at Balliol College, Oxford where he read modern history. After a scholarship in America, he worked in the Cabinet Office and the Conservative Research Department where he became the director under Margaret Thatcher.

He became MP for Bath in 1979 and held several ministerial posts, becoming Secretary of State for the Environment in 1989 and chairman of the Conservative Party in 1990.

Lord Patten was governor of Hong Kong from 1992 to 1997, overseeing the return of the territory to China. He was chairman of the Independent Commission on Policing for Northern Ireland set up under the Good Friday Peace Agreement from 1998 to 1999.

Lord Patten was appointed European Commissioner for External Relations in 1999 and held this post until November 2004. He was appointed a Companion of Honour in 1998 and became a member of the House of Lords in 2005. He became a Commandeur of the Legion d'Honneur in 2016.

Lord Patten was chairman of the BBC Trust, the strategic authority for the broadcaster, from 2011 to 2014.

He helped to coordinate the visit of Pope Benedict to the United Kingdom in 2010 and became chairman of the Vatican Media Advisory Committee for Pope Francis in 2014.



He holds a number of honorary degrees, was chancellor of Newcastle University from 1999 until 2008, and was elected chancellor of the University of Oxford in 2003. He chaired the International Crisis Group from 2004 to 2011 and became co-chair of UK-India Round Table in 2006.

Lord Patten has written a number of books – The Tory Case (1982), East and West (1998), Not Quite The Diplomat (2005) and What Next?: Surviving the 21st Century (2008).

Lord Patten married Lavender Thornton, a lawyer, in 1971. They have three daughters, Kate, Laura and Alice and eight grandchildren.

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
