Three-month-old Tayyabullah is quiet and motionless. His mother Nigar moves the oxygen pipe away from his nose and puts a finger below his nostrils to check if she can feel him breathing.

She begins to cry as she realises her son is fading.

At this hospital in Afghanistan, there is not a single working ventilator.

Mothers hold oxygen tubes near their babies' noses because masks designed to fit their small faces are not available, and the women are trying to fill in for what trained staff or medical equipment should do.

Every day, 167 children die in Afghanistan from preventable diseases, according to the UN children's fund Unicef - illnesses that could and should be cured with the right medication.

It is a staggering number. But it's an estimate.

And when you step inside the paediatric ward of the main hospital in the western province of Ghor, you will be left wondering if that estimate is too low.

Multiple rooms are full of sick children, at least two in each bed, their little bodies ravaged by pneumonia. Just two nurses look after 60 children.

In one room, we saw at least two dozen babies who appeared to be in a serious condition. The children should have been continuously monitored in critical care - impossible at this hospital.

Yet, for the million people who live in Ghor, this basic facility is still the best equipped public hospital they can access.

TOKYO — Advanced machine tools made by Japanese manufacturers were found at a Chinese research facility that is responsible for developing nuclear weapons.

Machine tools are subject to export controls because they could be used to manufacture weapons of mass destruction. However, an investigation by Nikkei revealed that products from Japan and Germany were being delivered to the nuclear weapons development organization through biddings inside China.

How should companies deal with this issue and the vast market of China as Western governments increasingly encircle China for economic security?

Over the past year, Nikkei analyzed more than 900 public tenders while exploring China's supply chain to find procurements supporting its nuclear weapons development, and we published the results in our report "[Western machine tools evade sanctions to fuel China's nuclear program](#)." From 2007 to his retirement in 2021, Mokhtar made the half-an-hour drive countless times to the nearby Sungai Batu archaeological site, where he and his team from Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) uncovered evidence of a thriving iron export industry dating as far back as 788 BC.

For context, this is much older than the famous monuments of Borobudur (8th century) in Indonesia and Angkor Wat (12th century) in Cambodia, making Sungai Batu and the larger Bujang Valley complex it is part of the oldest civilisation in Southeast Asia.
